The year in review

Pre-season

There was no indoor league in 2022/3 which meant a pretty quiet off season. Unusually we also started 2023 with very similar squads to those we had had in 2022. We did do a limited amount of indoor training pre season and the Sunday indoor sessions at the dome in February and March gave a couple of us some preparation for the league season ahead.

Division 2

It was deja vu all over again for the Tigers in 2023 as we again finished 3rd in Division 2 with an almost identical record to the one we had in 2022. Overall we played well, though we had a couple of wobbles defensively when put under pressure by the bigger hitting teams. Going forward the team would benefit from playing more tournaments together as a group.

The squad was largely the same as in 2022. There were some changes, Sara came in and Alyssa departed, Oli moved up from Div 3, Rob actually managed to play some games this season, Holly returned from maternity leave but Nadia only played a few games before pregnancy claimed her. Natasha moved up to Division 2 for the last few weeks of the season.

Two of our best performances of the season were the two wins against Mavericks 2, though perhaps the most unlikely, and satisfying, win was when a patched up team, including a large Tiggers contingent and one player who had never played before, put Freeze to the sword.

Division 3

It was always going to be tough for the Tiggers in 2023. Oli moved up to the Tigers squad this year and Glen's move to flying long haul meant he was unavailable. On top of that injuries meant that Emma and Michal hardly played at all this year. James did join the team from the Tigers but shift work meant he could only play 1 week in 3.

All those things combined with other absences meant that we never really managed to put a settled side on the pitch. A rather bizarre league schedule didn't help, with our opponents in the 2nd half of the season being decided on the basis of results in 2022 rather than those in the first half of this year. All this conspired to make wins a rare event. In the 2nd half of the season in particular we were good enough to keep games close, but not good enough to win any of them.

It wasn't all gloom and doom, team morale stayed high and there were good individual performances, perhaps the most noteworthy coming from new boy Josh who in his first softball season rapidly became an effective batter and outfielder.

Tournaments

Our best team performances were at the Manchester tournament where we played really well, reaching the semi final and taking that game to extra innings before falling to the eventual winners (Famille Casling).

That weekend was the highlight of an otherwise slightly disappointing season. We didn't play in as many events as normal as we didn't manage to get a team together for Liverpool and couldn't get a space at North West 2.

We had an enjoyable time at the other tournaments we did enter but the closest we got to winning silverware in any of those was finishing as rec runners up at NW1 (despite finishing last in the round robin (ahem)).




